

Sorting is pretty easy

Almost everything around you can be recycled. It's just a matter of putting it in the right place. Drop off your sorted material in the designated container at your property, at our mobile recycling centre or at the fixed recycling centers. Here are some examples of what to leave where.

- Raw and cooked leftovers
- Grounds, filter from coffee and tea
- Rind and bones from meat, fish, poultry and seafood
- Peel, skin from fruit and vegetables



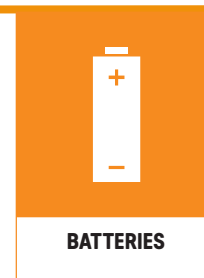
FOOD WASTE

Sort in the brown paper bag and then leave in your brown waste bin.

REMEMBER! No plastic in the food waste.

This bag cost 1kr/kg to recycle

- Alkaline batteries
- Lithium batteries

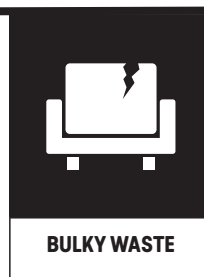


BATTERIES

Leave in a battery holder. They are usually found at grocery stores and recycling stations.

Batteries weighing more than three kilos should be taken to a recycling center.

- Strollers
- Small furniture
- Toys



BULKY WASTE

Recycle more! Sell them, take them to a second-hand shop or recycle them at the nearest recycling center or our mobile recycling center.

- Glass (coloured, uncoloured)
- Plastic and Styrofoam
- Cardboard
- Metal
- Newspapers



PACKAGING

Sort at designated recycling stations. TIP! Empty packaging and flatten it to save space.

- Acetone
- Paints and chemicals
- Light sources
- Nail polish
- Spray bottles (not empty)
- Plant protection products
- Gas cylinders



HAZARDOUS WASTE

Putting hazardous waste in the regular garbage is prohibited by law. Take it to your nearest recycling centre or our mobile recycling center.

- Fabrics and textiles
- Clothing
- Shoes



TEXTILES

Recycle more! Sell them, take them to a second-hand shop or recycle them at the nearest recycling center or our mobile recycling center, or in the collection bins at some recycling stations.

- Old or unused medicines
- Inhalers and nasal sprays with content.



MEDICINE

Return them to a pharmacy.

Of course, the best thing is not to pick up more medicine than you need.

- Battery powered stuff
- Bulbs and light sources
- Mobile phones
- Televisions

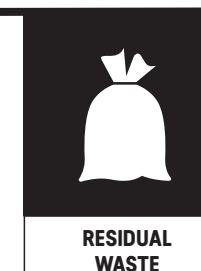


SMALL ELECTRONICS

Take to your nearest recycling center or our mobile recycling center. You can also take your electrical waste to any shop that sells electronics.

In the bag for residual waste, you sort things that cannot be recycled anywhere else. For example:

- Diapers
- Cigarette butts and snuff
- Envelopes



RESIDUAL WASTE

Leave the bag in the residual waste bin. If you sort correctly, it will take a while before the bag is full.

GOOD JOB!

This bag costs 4 kr/kg to recycle

- Ceramics
- Plaster boards and insulation
- Sanitation (toilets, sinks)



CONSTRUCTION WASTE

Construction waste is leftovers from renovation or remodeling. Sorted construction waste is handed over to a recycling center.

TIP! With our funnel you can collect fat and oil from cooking instead of pouring it down the drain.



You use the funnel on a PET bottle or milk carton. When it's full you bring the bottle to the recycling center or the mobile recycling center.

You can pick up the funnel from us at Knista gårds väg 12.
